In ancient times, the custers varied in different periods. In the Song Dynasty, all men and worsh, both adults and children, whether rich or poor, pet on adult glights to burn incomes and worship the meso, so expose wishes and party for happiness. In the South Dynasty, therein and families presented mouncakes to each other. Since the Ming and Qing Dynasty, the customs of the Mid-Auturan Perival were more popular. They kept traditions which included burning incomes, admiring event Oemanthus flowers, setting towers alight, huming pagedas, performing the fire drappet, and displaying Insterns.


