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Lesson Plan: Egg Hunt

Narrative Writing using Easter Basket Craft Book

- "Distance Learning Writing Task: Egg Hunt" on next page is an assignment direction for students to complete the Egg Hunt writing all by themselves. All you need to do is to give them the "Distance Learning Writing Task: Egg Hunt", the Teacher Writing Sample, the two Student Writing Samples, and blank Easter Basket sheets (one for cover page, five for actual writing.)
- For normal classroom teaching, you can follow "Distance Learning Writing Task: Egg Hunt", though you have more flexibilities in every steps.
- Student Writing Samples are from my first graders.
- You could not only use the "Distance Learning Writing Task: Egg Hunt" as an assignment, but also use it as an independent writing center activity.
- You could also use the Easter Basket Craft Book for any Easter related writings.

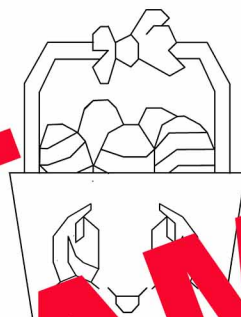
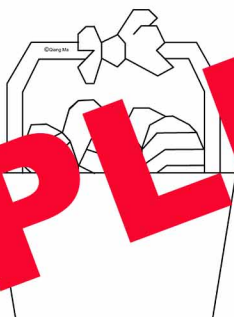
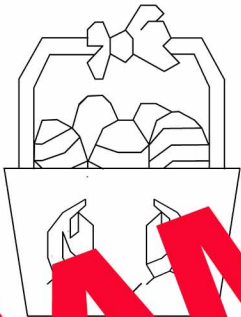
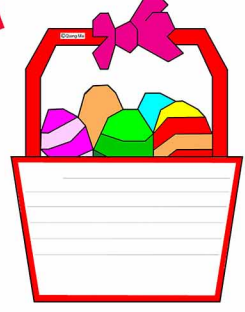
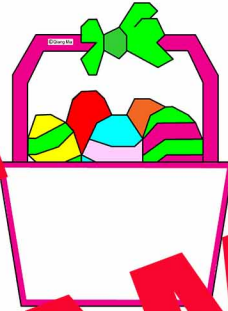
- Introduction
 - You are going to write an Easter egg hunt story using the Easter Basket Craft Book pages.
 - The main character will be Rabbit. She is going on a journey of egg hunt. Remember: at beginning, Rabbit decided for an egg hunt; in the middle, there are three mini stories of finding each individual egg; at the end, Rabbit completed her task and back to where she was at the beginning.
 - This is a six page-writing project: one page for the cover, one page for the beginning, three pages for the middle, and one page for the ending.
 - Read the Teacher Writing Sample and also look at the two Student Writing Samples about their writings and illustrations/colorings. The Teacher Writing Sample are from first graders.
 - You should try to use some additional phrases to describe the crafts like similes and metaphors. You can also use the Teacher Writing Sample as a guide. - Cover Page
 - Look at the Teacher Writing Sample and Student Writing Samples. Write the title "Egg Hunt" and your name.
 - Color your page. Remember, you don't need to color the same way as those samples. Color your own way and be creative.
- Page 1 – Beginning of the Story
 - You are going to introduce the main character Rabbit, specify the setting (place and time), and problem.
 - Look at page 1 of Teacher Writing Sample. In this sample: place is home in bed; time is early morning (woke up, alarm); problem (need to go for an egg hunt.)
 - Put Teacher Writing Sample away.
 - Now start to write this page. Color the page. Edit the page.

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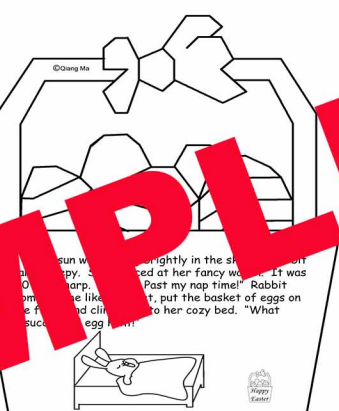
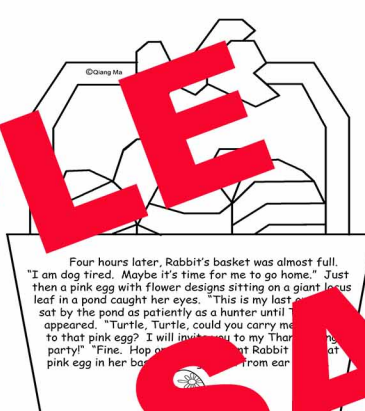
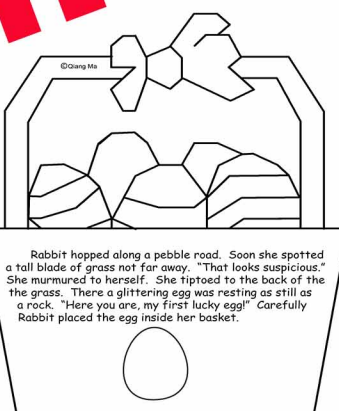
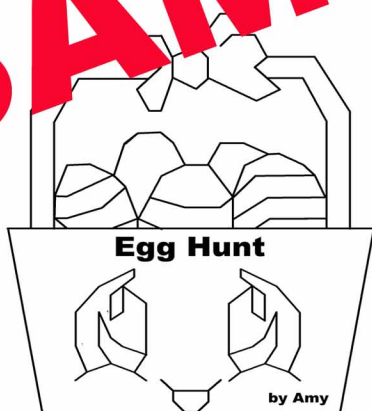
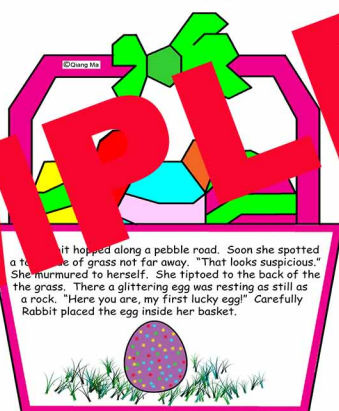
- Page 2 - Middle of the Story: Event One
 - You are going to write about how Rabbit found her first egg. Ensure to specify the setting (place and time), the problem, and solution.
 - Look at page 2 of Teacher Writing Sample. In this sample: place is the pebble road; time is assumed; problem is the egg kept on rolling; solution is to ask Eagle to help.
 - Put Teacher Writing Sample away.
 - Now start to write this page. Color the page. Edit the page.
- Page 3 - Middle of the Story: Event Two
 - You are going to write about how Rabbit found her second egg. Ensure to specify the setting (place and time), the problem, and the solution.
 - Look at page 3 of Teacher Writing Sample. In this sample: place is Green Valley; time is assumed; problem is the egg kept on rolling; solution is to ask Eagle to help.
 - Put Teacher Writing Sample away.
 - Now start to write this page. Color the page. Edit the page.
- Page 4 – Middle of the Story: Event Three
 - You are going to write about how Rabbit found her third egg. Ensure to specify the setting (place and time), the problem, and the solution.
 - Look at page 4 of Teacher Writing Sample. In this sample: place is the pebble road; time is assumed; problem is the egg kept on rolling; solution is to ask Eagle to help.
 - Put Teacher Writing Sample away.
 - Now start to write this page. Color the page. Edit the page.
- Page 5 – End of the Story
 - You are going to write about how Rabbit completed her task of egg hunt.
 - Look at page 5 from Teacher Writing Sample. In this sample: task completed - basket full of eggs.
 - Put the Teacher Writing Sample away.
 - Now start to write this page. Color the page. Edit the page.
- Making Books
 - Cut the pages out. Staple them together in order.

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- Editing & Sharing
 - Edit (both the writing and the drawing/coloring).
 - Share your writings with at least two audience.
 - You might need to do a final editing upon completion.
